### **Free Spirit Group**

The Free Spirit Group continues to meet twice weekly with an average attendance of 15 addicts per meeting. We alternate reading from the Living Clean and the JFT on Mondays and Wednesdays. Once a month we read from the SPAD and once a month we have a topic discussion.

On June 3, the group met to discuss the Disruptive and Predatory Behaviour guidelines. There were 13 members in attendance. We reviewed the guidelines and discussed how to apply them in our group. We held our regular monthly business meeting on July 8 with 6 group members in attendance. The group discussed the funded travel policy – all were in agreement that it should be kept as is because it helps build unity within the area and does not represent a significant amount of funds.

During this cycle, the group brought in \$464 in 7<sup>th</sup> contributions and literature sales. We paid \$22 for a celebration, \$120 for rent for the remainder of the year. The group placed a literature order for \$95.35, leaving a contribution to area of \$226.65.

### **Living In The Miracle Group**

Good morning, NA Family,

The Living in the Miracle Group continues to meet twice weekly, on Sundays and Fridays, with an average attendance of 15 addicts per meeting. We alternate our readings between the Basic Text and It Works: How and Why. On the first Sunday of each month, we hold a candlelight meeting and read from a selected NA pamphlet. We also host a Games Night on the third Friday of every month. All home groups are welcome to attend.

The group holds our monthly business meetings on the first Sunday of every month, June 7, 2026 with 6 homegroup members in attendance and July 5, 2026 with 5 members. At our July business meeting, Amethyst was elected as our Alternate GSR. Since April 1, we have welcomed five new members, bringing our total home group membership to 14 addicts.

We continue to search for a new meeting facility that will provide greater accessibility for our members.

During this cycle, the group brought in \$553.40 in 7th contributions and literature sales. Our total expenses were \$24.50, rent was \$170. We placed a literature order for \$48.94. This leaves a contribution to area of \$309.96.

The motion to adopt the Disruptive, Sexual, and Predatory Behaviour Guidelines reached group consensus. The Living in the Miracle Group also supports maintaining the Fellowship Development Fund for its intended purpose: to strengthen the unity of our Fellowship and provide opportunities for addicts to broaden their recovery experience.

## **Alt-RCM Report**

Good morning NA Family,

As your Alt RCM, I would like to provide you with a summarized report from the Regional meeting which was on Zoom May 24th, 2026. Here is an overview of activity across several areas, including Newfoundland & Labrador, Northern New Brunswick, and Prince Edward Island and Central Nova Area.

NL:

Activities/Convention committee

Newfoundland convention June 5 - June 7

There was a speaker jam fundraiser in March, a games night in May and April they held an online trivia fundraiser.

PI/PR

Their public relations committee has helped search for new groups all across the province some small towns that have either never had or haven't in a while had a meeting. PI hosted a community event for youth on bell island in May. There were interactive booths where they shared experience strength and hope, while speaking to parents and their children together.

Newfoundland Area has multiple Open positions +1 vice chair RC M2, alternate treasurer, alternate secretary, treasurer coordinator, policies and procedures chair.

They mentioned their biggest issue right now is money and the fact that they have none.

NNB:

The New Beginnings Group and the Samedi d'été Clean Group both read positive reports showing growth in both groups. The Literature Chairperson has come up with prices on all items that have increased significantly. For example, a bronze medallion would cost the group \$15.66 if only one item were ordered. Discussion occurred over the high of literature and the costs around it, such as the exchange rate, shipping cost and the benefit of bulk purchasing. Paul C will get NNB hooked up with Jesse M, the NANB Literature person. Financially their Prudent Reserve is stable. They didn't have a contribution to Regional, but believe now that things are improving they will in the future.

NNB confirmed that no one is interested in going to Rimouski Prison. The ones that had been in before and had lockdown happen too many times, Renews is notorious for being on lockdown.

Tim has 3 volunteers from Fredericton and will start the process again to get them cleared. Tim will also be going.

PEI:

Meetings across PEI have been growing up to 60 addicts at some of their larger groups. PEI's 25th annual unity days went incredibly well. It was the first time they held it over 3 days, and it was decided that they are going to hold it as a Unity Days Convention.

PEI's PR and H&I committee have been working together to try get NA literature to all of their recovery homes and provincial jails.

H&I have been putting on meetings in those recovery homes and jails, and they have been a success. The meetings held at the Charlottetown Hospital has been attracting anywhere from 5-10 addicts.

CNA

Central Nova Area. They are averaging about 16 groups attending the Area out of 37. They had one new group join our Area last month name to be announced at a later date.

CNA ASC is doing well. Their subcommittees continue to function, although they are always looking for support, as there are many unfilled positions.

CNA Archives Committee converting to digital archives.

CNA Literature Committee is looking to fill the Chair or Vice Chair positions.

CNA PR Committee continues to fulfill H&I commitments at Marguerite, Detox, Men's and Women's Correctional Centre. There has been an ongoing discussion about Marguerite, which is a woman's recovery house, but has allowed men to participate in the presentations. Motions have been put forth at both the PR and the ASC to take only women. Due to gender and LBGTQ (etc.), some feel this is limiting. CNA is wondering if other Area's have had this issue?

CNA Groups in Cape Breton are having splintering subcommittees within Activities and PR, to better address the needs of the geographic location of Cape Breton. This is still a work in progress as they determine their needs and how to address them.

## **RCM Report**

The last Regional Service Committee meeting was held on Zoom on May 24<sup>th</sup>; RCMs representing all areas in our region were present. As always, if you are interested in reading the full minutes from the meeting, I can forward them to you.

Louise G was elected as PR chairperson. Several positions remain open: alternate delegate, vice chair, web coordinator and treasurer. If you are interested in serving at the regional level, talk to me or attend the next RSC meeting, August 9 on Zoom.

Our regional delegate attended the 50<sup>th</sup> World Service Conference in Los Angeles in May. There were 148 voting members (133 regional/zonal delegates + 15 world board members) from 47 countries. Two new regions were seated: Afghanistan and Region 10 Brazil. The CAR survey had input from 9,188 individual members and 53 delegates. Most of the motions had consensus, except motion 5 to replace human interpreters with AI. For new and revised service

tools, there was consensus to focus on revising the guide to local service and group booklet. IP#1 Who, What, How, and Why will be the first piece of literature revised to use gender neutral language. A new IP on disruptive and predatory behaviour will be developed. 10. Insurance – Andrea is the individual in contact with the provider. There was a question regarding where in the policy it states what specifically is insured and where it refers to an actual website or physical locations.  
Action – Andrea will verify whether insurance policy states specifically what is insured and where it references the website and whether physical locations are included. If not there, Andrea will reach out to the provider to determine if this information can be included.

## Open Forum

1. Phone Line – Penny had raised questions to Paul regarding how the phone line is paid to determine whether it could be paid by ASC directly as opposed to having it billed to a private credit care. It was found that the provider is in the US and requires payment by credit card. The potential to use a pre-paid credit card was raised however this was looked into in the past and was not possible. The account will auto-renew in August 2026. Consensus to leave the account on Paul's credit card and ASC will reimburse with the submission of the invoice (in US) and a copy of the amount charged to his credit card in CAD funds.

## New Business

1. Past due notice from NAWS

This information has been provided to NAWS on July 12, 2026 for them to verify their records. Cheques are attached as Appendix B. We have not heard back from them yet.

Cheque 127 was issued today in the amount of \$903.76 to pay invoice CPS-005776.
