RCM Report

A successful hybrid regional assembly was held on February 7th with approximately 50 members in attendance. In-person gatherings were held in Fredericton, Halifax, Cape Breton and St. John's. The assembly focused on the

upcoming CAT/CAR motions and the survey discussion topics: gender neutral language, MAT/DRT. and new and revised literature and service materials. There was also a speaker meeting on the joys of service, and the event closed with a recovery meeting hosted by the Newfoundland and Labrador Area. **ACTION - If your group has not already done so, please submit your CAT/CAR survey responses by April 1.** There is a group motion submission form on carna.ca under the assembly tab. The RD will be attending the World Service Conference (WSC) May 2–9 in Woodland Hills, California to represent our region and submit our votes on the World Board motions. NAWS has been working on updates to literature and service materials, visit na.org/naws-projects-and-surveys/ to view and provide input on these projects.

The last Regional Service Committee meeting was held on Zoom on February 8th; RCMs representing all areas in our region were present. As always, if you are interested in reading the full minutes from the meeting, I can forward them to you.

There are several positions open on the regional admin team: alternate delegate, vice chair, web coordinator, PR chairperson, and treasurer. I encourage anyone interested in getting involved in service at the regional level to check out the service committee guidelines and attend the next meeting, which will be held May 24 at 10 am on Zoom. Louise G was nominated for the PR chairperson position with full support from her area. Louise has an extensive service resume, including most recently a 4-year term as the Fellowship Development East chair for CANA. We will vote on this nomination at the next region meeting. I feel that she would be a great fit for this position, but if the area has any concerns please let me know.

The Regional Service Committee guidelines were updated by the admin team and sent to the areas for review. Any comments or concerns can be discussed during new business. The local workgroup for CCNA is still looking for volunteers for the arts and graphics point person. They are hoping someone from NANB will step up for this position. **ACTION - Please take it back to your groups.** For more information on the position, visit canadianconvention.com. The acting web coordinator put forward a motion to purchase DeepL translation software to translate reports for carna.ca. This would be used as a first step in translation, and then the documents would be sent to a French-speaking member for review. The Northern NB area expressed their appreciation for having materials available in French. Paul mentioned that there is a free version of this software that could be useful for smaller bits of text on the NANB website. Our web coordinator can connect with Paul to discuss. Treasurer's Report

It was noted we started the day below prudent reserve levels. Current amount in bank \$2,306.45.

Total donations to Area received today are \$1,140.21.

Total literature sales of \$830.39.

Total income today is \$1,970.60.

Outgoing expenses are \$528.38.

Top reserves back up will require \$393.55.

This leaves a balance of \$1,048.67 with which to do business.

Good Morning Family,

We held a successful H&I Orientation session on February 8th, 2026 for six interested addicts. Four members from the previous group have recommitted to H&I giving us a total of ten addicts to begin carrying the message of recovery to hospitals and institutions. We have been successful in working with Detox and a women's shelter to begin H&I in their facilities. Activities at Detox will commence on Wednesday, March 25th where we will be going every two weeks. We will start visiting the women's shelter on Thursday, April 2nd and will go once per month until we are able to have the new women complete their three observations as part of their orientation. We are excited with the progress we have made and look forward to sharing our experience, strength and hope.

Jesse M reported Saint John is still visiting Ridgewood twice a month. Bill C is doing a great job of scheduling volunteers.
